

Subject: COMMENDATION

I have been informed of your **Outstanding Performance of Duty** on November 7, 2018. While on patrol, Sergeant Salazar observed a suspicious subject at 0134hrs. in the area of 99th Place and Francisco Ave. The subject began to evasively run through several backyards and easements to attempt to evade Sergeant Salazar. A description of the subject was given out by the Sergeant to other responding units. Officers Guzman, Mason Davila, Wantroba and Warnicek quickly established a secure perimeter surrounding the area to be searched. The subject was spotted running and was apprehended by Officer Mason and assisted by Officer Warnicek by the CSX railroad tracks. The subject was found to possess proceeds from what was later determined to be personal property, bankcards and loose change that was not his. It was learned through further effort that the subject was burglarizing vehicles in that area. Felony approval was granted by the States Attorney's office for a charge of felony burglary. He was also charged with resisting arrest. See I.R. #18-05808.
